Ecclesia Semper Reformanda Est - "The Church is Always Reforming" This Latin phrase, dating back to St. Augustine in the 4th Century and popularized by other theology and since, points to the idea that the church must always be reexamining itself both internally and externally. Our church has existed in this same location for over 150 years, and yet the context, the people, the culture, the way of life of the community, has changed drastically in that time. And we must be willing to change as well.

This is not to say we ought to be changing our theology, to which we are fully committed, nor our understanding of God's Word, which stands true and unchanging through the ages. But instead, it points to the need for the church to always be reexamining it's *application* of God's word, both to the context of the day, and to the transforming hearts of the people. Just as speaking a foreign language is ineffective for communication, so speaking as if we're talking to a different context than the one we're in would be just as ineffective.

As Theologian Robert Godfrey puts it, there is a great danger in the church which he refers to as "formalism." As he writes, "The danger of formalism is that a church member could subscribe to true doctrine, participate in true worship in a biblically regulated church, and yet still not have true faith. As Jesus had warned against the Pharisees of His day, citing the prophet Isaiah, "This people honors me with their lips, but their heart is far from me" (Matt. 15:8). The part of religion that always needs reforming is the human heart. It is vital religion and true faith that must be constantly cultivated."

It is my prayer that, by the work and power of the Holy Spirit, our hearts will continue to be reformed and transformed into the likeness of Christ. And as that occurs, as disciples are raised up to carry forth the ministry of the gospel in our community, we will endeavor by any means to preach the truth of scripture and minister to our present context. Would we put no barrier in the way of anyone coming into our church, participating in the worship of the one true God, and hearing the Word of God read and preached. Would we be willing to sacrifice any tradition for the sake of the salvation of human souls. As Jesus directed, would we "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matt. 28:29-20)

Children's Sunday School Updates

We thought you would like to know what the younger children are studying this spring. Our curriculum is from *Great Commissions Publications*, which is affiliated with the PCA.

Spring curriculum for preschool Bible Buddies class

Our focus this spring is themed "Jesus is the Savior." Through Bible stories, the children will find out about Jesus love for his people, his death and resurrection, his ascension, the promised Holy Spirit and the Lord's return one day. Unit one helped the children discover that Jesus is the loving Savior who forgives sinners, like the lepers and Zacchaeus. In unit two they are finding out that Jesus is God's king, the Savior-king with his entry into Jerusalem, arrest, and death on the cross. And in the third unit, the emphasis is on Jesus the risen Lord, as He came alive again, showed himself to disciples, and returned to heaven with the promise to come again.

Spring curriculum for the early elementary Jesus Squad class

Our focus this spring is on "What it means to become devoted to God's Word." Using stories and passages from the Old and New Testaments, the children are studying the importance of God's Word – learning about those who followed God's Word and those who didn't. We hope they will discover what it means to hide God's Word in their hearts and live by it. In unit one they studied God as the creator which includes his promise of salvation in his Word – The Bible. In unit two they studied people in the Old Testament such as Asa and Ezra who trusted God and his Word, as well as Eli and his sons who disobeyed God's law. They are currently in unit three where they are learning how God's promise in the Old Testament was fulfilled in the New Testament through Jesus Christ. The last unit will address how to live by God's Word. Throughout this spring the children are learning more about how the Bible is organized and why it is all important.

The children in both classes are memorizing a different Bible verse each month. You can help them memorize and better understand what the verses mean!
