Reflection Before Service

“But how might his reading of Philippians benefit a modern Christian? The question may be answered by asking a series of other questions. Do we face uncertainty over death? Do we face tensions over the loss of a loved one? Are we afraid of becoming redundant as we get older, or of losing a sense of usefulness in the kingdom? Do we need to think what it means to transition better? And on the other side, do we feel tension in saying goodbye? Do we long for a word from a godly Christian that might help put our own future in perspective? Do we need to be reminded of what matters most as we have one foot in this world and one in eternity? If we answer yes to any of these questions, we must acknowledge the power this letter still has for today. Here is a letter for the twenty-first century as much as it was for the first century.” - Bruce A. Lowe, A Biblical-Theological Introduction to the New Testament: The Gospel Realized
